Productive visit by the President of Drummond Ltd. to the Port



With the visit of the President of Drummond Ltd. Colombia, José Miguel Linares, a Framework Agreement was signed to improve the healthcare sector in the municipalities within the company's area of influence in Magdalena. This agreement will make it possible to work in coordination with the government of Magdalena on the construction of the Pediatrics area of the San Cristobal Hospital in Cienaga, repairing the emergency room at the hospital in Algarrobo and the remodeling of the hospital in Aracataca. The agreement signing ceremony was attended by the Mayors of Cienaga, Zona Bananera, Aracataca, Fundación and Algarrobo.

Along with the governor of Magdalena, Luis Miguel Cotes, the president of Drummond Ltd. José Miguel Linares, signed the agreement that seeks to improve the healthcare sector in the communities close to Puerto Drummond. During his visit, the President of the Company attended other meetings, including one with city leaders and businessmen, at which time he presented the new direct loading system and various essential aspects for the company, such as its commitment to the environment and its communities. Linares also met at the Universidad Jorge Tadeo Lozano with another group from the production sector, attended by Corpamag, the Bank of the Republic, the Maritime Museum Foundation, the Quinta de San Pedro Alejandrino historical site, Seguros y Pensiones, the Association of Business Owners of the Magdalena and the construction company El Prado S.A.S., as well as the heads of the educational institutions Universidad Jorge Tadeo Lozano, Universidad Sergio Arboleda and Universidad del Magdalena, and former mayors and governors.

Mr. Linares also took the opportunity to visit the facilities of Consorcio DIA, a company contractor, where he highlighted the growth of these types of companies in the region. Furthermore, on the occasion of the festival of La Virgen del Carmen, he celebrated with a group of approximately 100 people including employees and drivers from that company.

The President also engaged in dialogue with the employees where he mentioned the evolution and progress of the direct loading system, among other topics, and also explained that the idea was to strengthen these opportunities to share information to be able to better understand the company's progress and future.
